Parent and Family Engagement Policy/Plan and Procedures

PART I-SCHOOL PARENT AND FAMILY ENGAGEMENT POLICY/PLAN REQUIRED COMPONENTS

 - The annual meeting will be held in conjunction with Meet the Teacher night on August 15, 2022 from 4:00-6:00 p.m.
 - A slide show will be presented with information regarding the Title 1 program at FBE.
 - Teachers are available to answer questions and provide suggestions for support at home.
 - Resources about literacy and helping your child at home are available for parents.
- C. Flexible meeting times will be offered, such as meetings in the morning or evening, with funds provided under Title 1.
 - Meeting times are scheduled on different days of the week and at different times with the hope to accommodate as many families as possible.
 - Information is made available on Class DOJO for parents that are unable to attend.
 - Parents are offered the opportunity to choose conference times that meet their needs and/or the option to conference via phone or Google meet.
- D. Parents will be involved in an organized, ongoing, and timely way, in the planning, review, and improvement of the school plan under Section 1112, schoolwide under Section 1114, and the process of the school review and improvement under Section 1116.
 - Parents play an integral role in assisting in their child's learning and therefore they are encouraged to be
 actively involved in their child's education at school. Parents are included, as appropriate, in
 decision-making and on advisory committees to assist in the education of their child.
- E. Implementation of an effective means of outreach to parents of English learners, in a language the parents can understand, will inform them regarding how the they can—

 - o attain English proficiency;

- Parents of ELs can have a translator present at school meetings to help with communication.

To ensure effective involvement of parents and to support a partnership among the school involved, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement, **each school and district must**:

- Assist parents in understanding the challenging State academic standards, how to monitor a child's progress, and work with educators.
- Parents have access to the parent portal to see the child's grades and missing/late assignments.
- Interim reports are sent midway through the reporting period.
- Progress reports are sent home at the end of each nine weeks.
- MAP testing data will be sent home to parents.
- Fall/Spring Growth Assessment data will be sent home.
- Conferences will be held twice a year or more if needed.
- Provide materials and training to help parents to work with their children, such as literacy training and using technology (including education about the harms of copyright piracy).
 - o Preschool backpacks are sent home with each child in preschool.
 - o Books are sent home with participating students.
 - o Magnetic letters, journals, pencils, crayons and summer workbooks are sent home for summer enrichment.
 - o Parents will be invited to participate in Title 1 nights to learn about ways to help their child at home.

- Provide professional development to teachers, specialized instructional personnel, and other staff on the value of parents and their communities to increase academic achievement.
 - o Teachers and parents will participate in DPAC (District Parent Advisory Council) two times per year.
 - o Links to VDOE (Virginia Department of Education) website for informational videos will be provided.
- Coordinate and integrate parent engagement programs and activities with other Federal, State, and local programs, including public preschool programs, and conduct other activities, such as parent resource centers, that encourage and support parent engagement.
 - o Parent engagement materials will be handed out during the Title 1 annual meeting.
 - o Preschool parents will be invited to participate in a virtual literacy night.
 - o Families will be invited to participate in Pastries with the Principals as a way to connect with families and encourage involvement in their student's education.
 - o Parents will be invited to a BINGO night where we will send home books, flashcards, and games.
 - o Parents will be invited to participate in the annual Words and Picture night. Parents will be able to move through literacy stations with their child centered around a common theme.
 - o Parents will be invited to participate in the cardboard challenge with their child using the book <u>If I Build a School</u> as the theme.
 - o Packets will be distributed to incoming kindergarten parents with literacy materials.
 - o Packets will be sent home at the end of the year with all preschool students.
- Ensure that information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is sent to the parents. of participating children in a format and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand.
 - o Information sent home will be made available in a language that they can understand.
 - o Messages on Class DOJO can be translated into the dominant language.
 - o A translator will be available if required in an in person meeting.

The following are allowable activities:

- 1) May involve parents in the development of training for teachers, principals, and other educators to improve the effectiveness of such training.
- 2) May provide necessary literacy training from funds received under this part if the district has exhausted all other reasonably available sources of funding for such training.
- 3) May pay reasonable and necessary expenses associated with local Parent and Family Engagement activities, including transportation and childcare costs, to enable parents to participate in school-related meetings and training sessions.
- 4) May train parents to enhance the involvement of other parents.
